India's demographic dividend can translate into enduring growth only when its youth are equipped with employable skills and be an integral part of the growing economy and the underserved communities are made to involve meaningfully in the development process.



Our skilling and livelihood initiatives invest in human capital, helping raise incomes, widen employment opportunities, and create inclusive growth that multiplies across generations.



Backed by a strong legacy of community impact, Bajaj Finserv, through Bajaj Beyond, is dedicated to shaping a better future for the youth of today and tomorrow. Our initiatives are focused on Youth Skilling, Child Education, Child Health, Child Protection and Inclusion for Persons with Disabilities (PwDs).



Corporate Social Responsibility

We have our flagship skilling initiative, Skillserv, which is self-implemented while other skilling and child-specific interventions are routed through NGOs via grants. We work closely with grassroot organisations, partners, schools, institutions and hospitals to drive meaningful change in the society.

In FY2026, we implemented 291 projects with a CSR spend of ₹416 crore.



Youth Skilling: Preparing the Workforce of Tomorrow

Our skilling ecosystem is designed to bridge the gap between academic potential and industrial excellence through a dual-delivery model, self-implemented and through NGO grants.

Self-implemented: Skillserv Programme

Skillserv, our self-implemented skilling initiative, serves as an incubator for future BFSI professionals. Built on strong internal expertise, it is designed to create industry-ready talent and has several programmes under the umbrella, including NCVET-approved Certificate Programme in Banking Finance and Insurance (CPBFI), Microfinance, Gold Loans. It also has other digital programmes, Insurance Marketing Professionals Academy and the newly introduced Housing Finance. All the programmes are co-created with the help of respective business teams. They are divided as college-based or centre-based.

1. College-based: Certificate Programme in Banking, Finance and Insurance

This is the widely implemented and flagship programme that builds foundation and teaches students about the fundamentals of BFSI. A 120-hour module, it has been designed to equip the youth with the knowledge and skills that make them industry-ready. The CPBFI participants are mostly first-generation graduates, primarily young aspirants from Tier 2 and Tier 3 cities. In FY2026, 45,389 students were trained bringing our total college reach to 557 colleges across 160 districts. Since inception it has trained ~159,000 youth.

2. Centre-based: Gold Loan and Microfinance Programmes

The Skillserv Centre Model is co-created by Bajaj business teams to provide comprehensive skill development and employment opportunities to youth by leveraging independent training centres. This model focuses on equipping participants with market-relevant skills and ensuring their successful transition to the workforce. The Centre programme have trained over 2,690 students, in 25 districts in FY2026.

Microfinance Training Programme

- + This 180-hour course prepares individuals to work in microfinance institutions that provide loans and savings services to self-help groups (SHGs) and low-income customers.
- + The individuals are trained to manage field operations and sales, group meetings, collections, and build trust with rural communities.
- + Along with theory, it also has a classroom simulation of 30 hours to give practical office experience to learners.

Gold Loan Training Programme

- + This 180-hour course is designed specifically for graduates seeking entry-level roles, the programme provides practical expertise in gold valuation, purity assessment and safe handling techniques.
- + Participants gain comprehensive skills preparing them for diverse career opportunities as Gold Loan Executives.
- + Along with theory it also has a classroom simulation of 20 hours to give practical office experience to learners.

A housing finance programme has also been introduced to the bouquet to be followed with General Insurance and more such will be piloted soon.

3. Insurance Marketing Professional Academy (IMPA)

The initiative trains individuals seeking new income sources and provides them with comprehensive knowledge of general insurance through a 3-day intensive programme. Individuals above 18 years of age who have completed 10th grade can enrol even with no prior background. The programme, that has trained 2,396 individuals in FY2026 is specifically designed for those seeking flexible working schedules, additional income, or the opportunity to help others protect their assets.



Apart from the specific certificate programme, Skillserv Leap Internship was piloted this year that provided on-the-job training initiative that bridges the gap between academia and the financial services industry. In its pilot phase across Wardha and Burhanpur region. The interns engaged in 'learning by doing' by shadowing field officers and supporting teams during high-demand periods like Diwali and summer vacations.

Skilling through Grant-making

The projects are implemented in collaboration with multiple non-profit organisations to offer a comprehensive range of training and skilling programmes aimed at employment, enterprise development, entrepreneurship and fellowship. The initiative encompasses vocational training, job readiness, healthcare skill development, skilling for Persons with Disabilities, incubation support, as well as scholarship and fellowship programmes.



1. Skilling Models for Income Generation

It focuses on providing specific and diverse training and skilling programmes across varied models to help bridge the employment gap and help them generate a steady income.

Sector-specific Vocational Training

It offers short- and long-term vocational programmes aligned with industry demand, covering both blue-collar technical trades and service-sector roles.

Aggregator and Community Models

By utilising a network of small NGO aggregators and maintaining deep community engagement, it reaches remote populations and orients them toward viable vocational careers.

Targeted Placement Strategies

Local and Migration Placement led initiatives, ensures that training translates into immediate income regardless of the candidate's geographic constraints.

Support for the Ultra-Poor

We implement specialised interventions for the most marginalised populations, focusing on foundational skilling to bring them into the economic mainstream.

Outcome-based Financing

In this model, returnable grants and blended finance approaches ensure accountability, with success measured through verified employment, income levels and sustained job retention for the projects.

Fellowship and Scholarship

It entails providing entrance preparation for competitive professional tracks and scholarships for meritorious, underprivileged students to ensure high-income potential.

Y4D Foundation: Enabling Youth Employability through Market-aligned Skilling

Limited access to quality training and employment opportunities often prevents youth from economically vulnerable families from achieving financial stability. To address this, Y4D Foundation, in partnership with Bajaj Finserv, delivers industry-aligned skilling programmes that equip youth with technical and life skills for sustainable employment. Through this initiative, 1,100 youth have been trained and placed in jobs, enabling financial independence and improved livelihoods.

Nikky Chauhan's journey reflects this impact. From Gautam Budh Nagar, she took on family responsibilities early due to financial constraints and her father's health condition. Determined to build a better future, she enrolled in a PCB Assembly Operator training programme, where she gained technical knowledge and confidence. Upon completion, she secured a good job and salary and became an earning member of her family.

Her journey highlights how access to the right skills and opportunities can turn responsibility into resilience and create pathways for sustainable livelihoods.

2. Self-Employment and Entrepreneurship Development

It focuses on strengthening the local economy by incubating micro-enterprises and supporting individual entrepreneurs.

Ecosystem Strengthening

We invest in the local entrepreneurial landscape, providing the necessary infrastructure and support systems for small businesses to thrive in their native environments.

Direct Enterprise Support

We offer individualised assistance to help practitioners move from subsistence work to structured Direct Enterprises, providing the tools and knowledge needed for business sustainability.

Incubation Programme

Through strategic incubation, we provide the push required for early-stage entrepreneurs to professionalise their operations, improve efficiency and help them scale.

Need-based Entrepreneurship

Initiatives are tailored to specific regional opportunities, ensuring that new businesses fulfil an actual market gap within their specific geography.

Financial Sustainability

By leveraging returnable grants for entrepreneurs, we create a revolving fund model that encourages business discipline while ensuring that capital is recycled to support the next wave of local innovators.



Saksham Project: Strengthening Rural Enterprises and Livelihoods

Traditional artisans in rural India often face limited market access, lack of formalisation, and low-income stability despite strong craftsmanship. To address this, the Saksham Project, implemented by Entrepreneurship Development Institute of India in partnership with Bajaj Finserv, supports rural enterprises through formalisation, capacity building, and market linkages. Through this initiative, 4,500 enterprises have been strengthened to improve incomes and create local employment.

Mitti Kala Udyog in Kushinagar reflects this impact. Led by Sunil and Govind Prajapati, the traditional pottery enterprise transitioned into a registered and growing business with MSME and GST registration, product innovation support, and market exposure. Today, it provides direct employment to over 25 individuals and supports many more indirectly.

This journey highlights how targeted support can transform traditional skills into sustainable enterprises.

3. Healthcare Skilling

In the healthcare domain, we support strengthening the medical ecosystem by enhancing the capacity of frontline professionals. Through targeted skilling initiatives and specialised fellowships, we build a robust workforce of nurses, paramedics and technical staff equipped to deliver high-quality clinical and preventive care.

Core Clinical and Allied Health Pipeline

Focusing on the 'Clinical Backbone', we support comprehensive programmes exceeding two years. These are strictly affiliated with Nursing or Paramedical Councils, encompassing professional nursing degrees, specialised Eye Care pipelines, and Mid-Level Clinical courses for Allied Health professionals.

Paramedical and Technical Capacity Building

To meet immediate industry needs, we offer agile programmes of less than two years. These are either self-affiliated or certified by Skilling Boards, focusing on enhancing the technical proficiency of paramedics and support staff through intensive fellowships and specialised technical modules.

Community and Preventive Health Cadre

We develop a dedicated workforce for Basic Support Services, focusing on grassroots health delivery. This cadre is trained to manage preventive health initiatives and community-level interventions, ensuring that healthcare reach extends beyond the hospital and into the heart of the community.



B-ABLE Foundation: Enabling Healthcare Careers through Skill Development

Limited access to higher education and industry-relevant skills often prevents youth from economically vulnerable backgrounds from securing stable employment. To address this, B-ABLE Foundation, in partnership with Bajaj Finserv, delivers healthcare-focused skilling programmes that equip youth with practical training and job placement support. Through this initiative, 320 youth have been trained and placed in jobs, enabling financial independence and career progression.

Nadeem Alamgir Jamadar's journey reflects this impact. A 22-year-old who had to pause his education due to financial constraints, he enrolled in a phlebotomy training programme to build employable skills. Upon completion, he secured a job, becoming financially independent and regaining confidence in his future.

His journey highlights how the right skills and guidance can help youth overcome uncertainty and build self-reliant, dignified careers.

4. Skill Development for Persons with Disabilities

We facilitate the holistic development of Persons with Disabilities (PwDs), including those with intellectual and developmental challenges by shifting focus from basic skilling to meaningful workforce participation. As an ecosystem enabler, we promote fostering of inclusive employment, entrepreneurship and advanced career progression. We enhance vocational skills through training tailored to individual needs, specifically targeting pre-vocation, access to employment, the service industry, enterprise and advanced career progression.

Chhanv Foundation: Building Leaders and Voices of Resilience

Acid attack survivors in India often face social stigma, limited livelihood opportunities and barriers to reintegration. To address this, Chhanv Foundation, in partnership with Bajaj Finserv, enables survivors through skill development, livelihood support, and leadership-building initiatives. Through this intervention, 40 survivors have been supported to rebuild confidence, access dignified employment and reintegrate into society.

Roopa's journey reflects this impact. A part of the movement since its early days, she has grown into a strong leader and advocate. As a host on The Sherioes TV and Associate Manager at Sherioes Café, Delhi, she amplifies survivor voices while mentoring others. Her growth is further strengthened by a hospitality certification from the Taj Mahal Hotel, New Delhi, and recognition at the Condé Nast Traveller India Top Restaurant Award for 'Spirit of Hospitality'.

Her story highlights how the right support can restore dignity and create pathways for inclusive growth.

5. Artisan Skilling

We support ecosystem-level collaboration by partnering with like-minded CSRs, impact firms, enablers, finance players and M&E organisations to design solution-oriented programmes. This involves exploring a layered approach to business development, including piloting in-depth programmes with existing partners to strengthen enterprise growth. Furthermore, we focus on educational integration through structured 1- to 2-year programmes in design development and business management, specifically designed to build the next generation of craft leadership among artisans.

Kadam India: Enabling Livelihoods through Skill Development

Limited access to skill development and livelihood opportunities often restricts women in rural areas from contributing to household income and achieving financial independence. To address this, Kadam India, in partnership with Bajaj Finserv, provides training in sustainable craft, design development, and market-oriented skills. Through this initiative, 400 women have been empowered to build livelihoods and improve their economic stability.

Sifa Layla Molla's journey reflects this impact. A homemaker from West Bengal, she had limited exposure to income-generating opportunities. Through the training, she learned to create water hyacinth products, enhancing her skills, confidence and creativity. Today, she contributes to her household income while continuing to grow her craft.

Her journey highlights how skill-based interventions can enable women to become self-reliant and create sustainable livelihood opportunities.

1. Child Education

The interventions are holistic, 'whole of school' approach, centred on the 5S Model School framework (Sundar, Safal, Saksham, Surakshit, and Shala). We support and strengthen foundational literacy and numeracy (FLN) while integrating vocational education, ICT systems and school health.

Digital and Tech-based Interventions

- + We collaborate with organisations to facilitate digital teaching interventions, harnessing technology to augment educational accessibility and effectiveness.
- + **4,415,000 children** are being supported.

Foundational Literacy and Numeracy

- + The projects target barriers to foundational learning and numeracy, with a specific focus on bolstering academic performance in core subjects through innovative approaches.
- + **2,030,425 children** are being supported.

Mental Health Interventions

- + Partnerships enable the facilitation of mental health interventions, encompassing emotional well-being promotion and behavioural issue mitigation, vital for fostering a conducive learning environment.
- + **427,350 children** are being supported.

Early Childhood Education

- + Centred on cognitive, social and emotional development, early childhood education initiatives prioritise language enhancement and school readiness, laying a strong foundation for future academic success.
- + **3,200 children** are being supported.

Comprehensive School Interventions

- + Comprehensive interventions encompass nutrition support, health checkups, and skill development to enhance employability, ensuring students are equipped with essential competencies for their academic and professional journey.

Akanksha Foundation: Enabling Education and Leadership for Underserved Youth

Limited access to quality education and financial constraints often hinder students from underserved communities from pursuing higher education and achieving their aspirations. To address this, Akanksha Foundation, in partnership with Bajaj Finserv, provides holistic education, mentorship, and continued alumni support to help students transition into higher education and leadership pathways. Through this initiative, 2,827 students have been supported to pursue higher education and build future-ready careers.

Ruchi Pandit's journey reflects this impact. An alumna of PKGEMS, she overcame financial hardship following

her father's job loss and continued her education with determination. She completed her HSC in Commerce, actively engaged in leadership programmes, and secured 100% financial aid to pursue a Bachelor of Arts in Social Science at Azim Premji University. Alongside her studies, she contributes to community initiatives, reflecting her commitment to giving back.

Her journey highlights how sustained educational support and mentorship can empower students to overcome challenges and emerge as future leaders.



2. Child Health

We are committed to improving long-term resilience and health outcomes for children under 18 battling Non-Communicable Diseases (NCDs). Moving beyond isolated treatment, our 'whole-of-child' approach integrates early diagnosis, community-based screening, and infrastructure enhancement to create a sustainable support system for the most vulnerable. By acting as an ecosystem enabler, we collaborate with strategic partners to strengthen hospital capacity and frontline networks, ensuring specialised care is both high-quality and accessible.

Cleft Care

- + We are dedicated to supporting children born with cleft lip and palate conditions, ensuring access to timely surgeries and comprehensive care.
- + In collaboration with Smile Train India, we launched the **Maha Smiles – Cleft Care for Every Child** initiative in Maharashtra. To strengthen community outreach, we work closely with ASHA and RBSK workers as well as FOGSI, enabling early identification and referral.
- + To further extend care to underserved regions, the initiative has built a network of partner hospitals and introduced fellowship programmes, enhancing both capacity and reach.
- + **48,120 children** are being supported.

Cancer and Epilepsy Care

- + Specialised support has been extended to children for advanced cancer treatments as well as critical epilepsy surgeries and medicinal assistance.
- + **5,030 children** being supported

Paediatric Heart Care

- + We address the national burden of Congenital Heart Disease (CHD) via a holistic 'four-pillar' model that provides high-quality treatment entirely free of cost. Acting as an ecosystem enabler, we strengthen the RBSK referral network in Pune through large-scale training of healthcare workers and specialised newborn screening at partner hospitals to ensure early identification and timely surgery.
- + Our collaboration also includes the establishment of advanced OTs and ICUs, and the launch of accredited residential healthcare skilling programmes for nursing and GNM students to ensure workforce readiness. To drive long-term resilience, we also support a pioneering research-based genomic study focused on the Indian population, combining immediate life-saving surgeries with the research and capacity building necessary to transform paediatric cardiac care.
- + Close to **3,455 children** are being supported.



Community, Treatment support and Healthcare Infrastructure

- + The initiative strengthens treatment support and ensures end-to-end care for children, including those with chronic and critical conditions. It also focuses on critical and specialised paediatric care, complemented by direct financial assistance to improve access to timely treatment.
- + To ensure service delivery excellence, hospitals are equipped with advanced paediatric medical equipment and healthcare workers are trained, directly enhancing outcomes for children.
- + Close to **7,770 children** being supported.



Type 1 Diabetes (T1D) Centre of Excellence

- + We support interventions for children with Type 1 Diabetes for their holistic care. **Sweetlings Centre of Excellence** at Jehangir Hospital has transformed from a once-weekly clinic into a state-of-the-art facility operating six days a week, through our support.
- + This infrastructure upgrade addresses long-standing staffing and capacity challenges, providing a child-friendly environment equipped with dedicated consultation rooms and advanced medical systems.
- + By integrating a multidisciplinary team of specialists with a 24-hour helpline and school outreach, the Centre has scaled its 'Sweetlings' programme to provide continuous, holistic care for both underprivileged and self-paying patients, significantly expanding access to life-saving diabetes management.
- + **2,980 children** are being supported.

HCJMRI: Enabling Comprehensive Care for Children with Chronic Conditions

Chronic health conditions like diabetes can significantly impact a child's growth, confidence, and ability to lead an active life, especially for families with limited resources. To address this, HCJMRI, in partnership with Bajaj Finserv, provides free medical support, regular checkups, and continuous guidance to children, ensuring better health outcomes and quality of life. Through this initiative, **4,330 children** have been supported to manage their conditions and lead active, fulfilling lives.

Taha Qureshi's journey reflects this impact. Diagnosed with diabetes at the age of two, he faced early health challenges, but with consistent medical support and care, regained confidence and strength. Today, he actively participates in sports, and excels in academics and extracurricular activities, earning multiple recognitions.

His journey highlights how timely healthcare support and encouragement can empower children to overcome challenges and achieve their full potential.

3. Child Protection

Our child protection strategy adopts an Integrated Community Approach to shield vulnerable children from trafficking, abuse, and labour. We combine System Strengthening with a Communities Model to drive behavioural change. We utilise both Model CCIs for institutional safety and prioritise Non-Institutional Care to provide tailored rehabilitation. This holistic framework now extends to Children in Conflict with the Law, ensuring they access the development opportunities necessary to become productive citizens.

Institutional Care

- + Comprehensive support was provided to shelter homes and child welfare institutions, ensuring safe housing and holistic care.
- + **2,318 children** are being supported.

Rescue and Rehabilitation

- + Child rescue operations were conducted at railway platforms, with a focus on reuniting children with their families and rehabilitating them.
- + **3,340 children** are being supported.

Adoption and Daycare Support

- + Safe spaces and early childhood care services were provided for children of construction workers, ensuring their well-being.
- + **8,804 children** are being supported.

Community Protection Programmes

- + Education and protection programmes were integrated to empower children in vulnerable communities and improve their employability.
- + **11,378 children** are being supported.

Aftercare and Transition Support

- + We provide ongoing guidance and assistance to children transitioning between phases of life, ensuring continuity of care and support beyond immediate interventions.
- + **2,291 children** are being supported.

Awareness and Sensitisation

- + Collaborative efforts extend to raising awareness and sensitising communities about the issue of child sexual abuse, partnering with various organisations to create a safer environment for children and prevent instances of abuse and exploitation.
- + **54,656 children** are being supported.

Committed Communities Development Trust (CCDT): Enabling Care, Stability and Emotional Growth for Vulnerable Children

Children from unstable family backgrounds often face emotional distress, disrupted education, and a lack of safe, supportive environments, impacting their confidence and development. To address this, Committed Communities Development Trust, in partnership with Bajaj Finserv, provides residential care, counselling, and life skills support to help children rebuild stability and continue their education. Through this initiative, 7,525 children have been supported to improve their emotional well-being, learning outcomes and overall development.

Pia's journey reflects this impact. Rescued from a vulnerable situation at a railway station and admitted to the centre, she initially struggled with emotional insecurity and adapting to school.

Through counselling, structured activities, and life skills training, she gradually learned to manage her emotions, build confidence and engage in her studies.

Her journey highlights how care, patience, and the right support can transform vulnerability into strength and create new beginnings.

4. Inclusion for Persons with Disabilities

We focus on the well-being of Persons with Disabilities (PwDs) by facilitating their inclusion into mainstream society. We address a variety of challenges, including intellectual, developmental, physical and locomotor disabilities, with a strong emphasis on early identification, intervention and counselling.

Rehabilitation and Comprehensive Care

- + Early therapies, parental counselling and continuous support programmes were implemented to enhance the quality of life for persons with disabilities.
- + **39,049 children** are being supported.



Educational Inclusion

- + It encompasses supporting special schools, inclusive education initiatives, and vocational training programmes aimed at empowering Persons with Disabilities (PwDs) through education. This involves establishing inclusive learning environments where students with and without disabilities learn together, utilising teaching methods tailored to accommodate diverse learning needs.
- + **6,708 children** are being supported.

Medical Rehabilitation

- + It provides access to aids, prosthetics and critical medical treatments was facilitated to improve mobility and health outcomes.
- + **378,818 children** are being supported.

Community-Based Inclusion

- + The implemented projects offer therapies, counselling, educational support, medical aids and employment opportunities at the community level. Self-help groups and mentorship programmes were introduced to promote self-reliance and inclusion.
- + **4,406 children** are being supported.

Competitive Exam and Fellowships

- + Students with disabilities were supported in clearing competitive exams, ensuring access to higher education and employment opportunities. Capacity-building programmes were launched to support special educators working with children with learning disabilities.
- + **670 children** are being supported.

Assistive Technology

- + Various technological advancements were leveraged to enhance disability support and accessibility for individuals with disabilities. We have partnered with various organisations and start-ups.
- + **3,931 children** are being supported.

Yugrishi Shriram Sharma Acharya Charitable Trust: Restoring Vision for Children through Accessible Eye Care

Limited access to timely and affordable eye care often leaves children with untreated vision impairments, affecting their education, confidence, and overall development. To address this, Yugrishi Shriram Sharma Acharya Charitable Trust, in partnership with Bajaj Finserv under the Bal Drishti initiative, provides free paediatric eye surgeries and quality treatment to children in need. Through this initiative, 350,000 children have been supported to regain vision and continue their education with confidence.

Shivam's journey reflects this impact. An eight-year-old who began losing his vision after a minor injury, he struggled with daily activities and social interactions. With timely intervention and support, he underwent eye surgery that restored his sight. Today, he has returned to school, plays confidently with his friends and enjoys his favourite activity—collecting colourful marbles.

His journey highlights how timely medical intervention and accessible care can restore not just vision, but also confidence, joy and a child's future.

Pune Centric Interventions

Our Pune-centric interventions focus on creating specialised, high-capacity hubs for paediatric care, treatment and counselling. Additionally, we are strengthening the city's healthcare infrastructure through a Multi-speciality Children's Hospital, ensuring that vulnerable families in the region have local access to world-class medical and surgical expertise under one roof.
